

### FREE academic support to students

- Success Coaches-work individually with student to give practical tips on time management, note-taking and study skills as well as leverage students strengths
- Peer Assistants-provide informal mentoring by outreaching during key times of the semester by two-way texting, answering questions via live chat, facilitating the WVUe 191 Campus Connection assignment, and meeting availability



- Increase usage of the Chatbot/Two-way texting



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
