

BENEITTS OF EARLY FAISA



- Financial aid application process will become more aligned with the college admission process.
- No need to estimate taxes or miss important deadlines while waiting for tax information!
- More families may be able to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool for tax information.
- LESS PRESSURE!





WHAT IS THE IRS DATA RETRIEVAL TOOL?

WHY USE THE IRS DRT?

- •Gives students and parents ability to transfer data from IRS to the FAFSA.
- Saves time!
- Increases accuracy of tax information.
- Minimizes need for additional follow-up to confirm tax information and prevents delays.





TIMELINE FOR 2017-18



September:

- Become an admitted student!
- Begin monitoring college email for updates
- Seek out private scholarships
- Students apply for an FSA ID
- Parents apply for an FSA ID

October:

- Submit FAFSA starting Oct. 1
- Submit WV PROMISE Scholarship application
- Schedule final ACT/SAT tests





TIMELINE FOR 2017-18



December:

 Award letters start for first-time freshmen

January:

 Incoming students should be admitted with most recent high school transcripts and ACT/SAT scores on file

February:

- WV PROMISE scholars must complete a FAFSA and the PROMISE application by March 1
- Award letters start for continuing students

March:

 Priority deadline for filing a FAFSA is March 1





SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS (SAP)

Financial Aid Eligibility

ACADEMIC PROGRESS COMPONENTS

- Minimum overall GPA based on level and attempted hours
- Minimum completion rate of attempted hours
- Maximum attempted hours



Meet all of the above = Maintain financial aid eligibility!



Coming Changes

Rank	Current Policy Attempted Hours	New Attempted Hours	Current Policy Minimum GPA	New Minimum GPA	Percentage of Attempted Hours
Freshman	1 – 28	1 – 29*	1.4	2.0	67%
Sophomore	29 – 58	30 – 59*	1.7	2.0	67%
Junior	59 – 88	60 – 89*	2.0**	2.0	67%
Senior	89 +	90+*	2.0	2.0	67%

- New minimum GPA standards will be part of the SAP measurement after spring 2017 grades post.
- These changes apply to undergraduate students for all campuses.

^{*}Effective spring 2018 after Office of the University Registrar changes are implemented fall 2017. **Changed from 1.9 to 2.0 at the end of spring 2016 due to immediate compliance issue.
